POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES

Singular	Plural
My favourite group's from France.	Our mum's from Germany.
Your cousin's a singer.	Your photo is on the internet.
Her / His dad's from Brazil.	Their new song is number 1.

Possessive adjectives show ownership and they come before the noun.

The subject can be singular or plural, but the possessive adjective does not change:

- **Our** friend **is** lovely.
- **Our** friends **are** lovely.

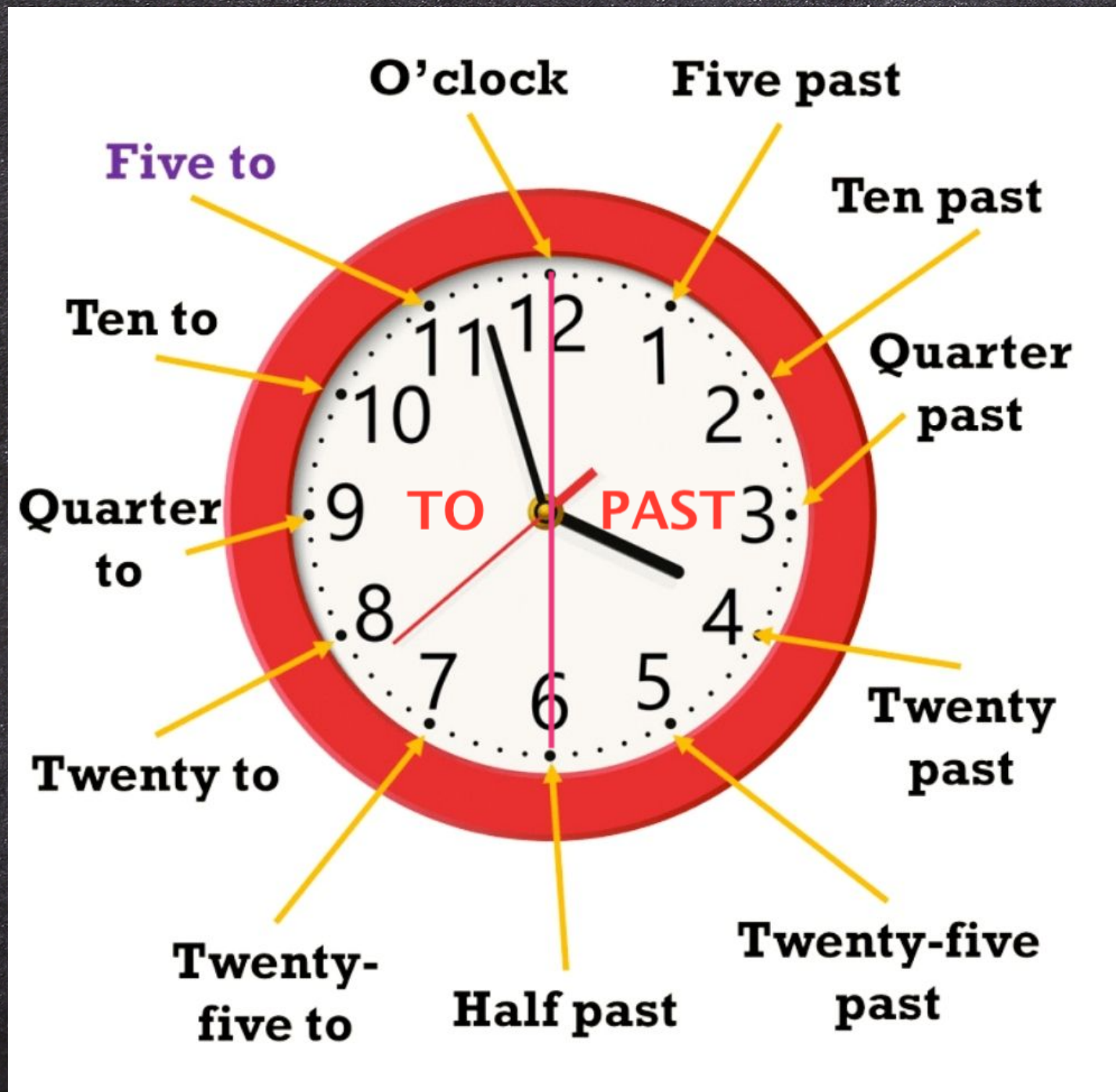
When the noun is singular, the verb is singular.

When the noun is plural, the verb is plural:

- **My** pen **is** black.
- **My** pens **are** black.

ASKING AND ANSWERING ABOUT TIME

Questions				Answers			
What time	is	it?		It's			twenty-five past eight.
	do	I / you / we / they	leave?	I / You / We / They	leave	at	
	does	she / he / it		She / He / It	leaves		

We use *What time is it?* when asking about the time right at that moment.

We use *It's* + the time to answer the question.

- **What time is it?**
It's five to ten.

We use *What time* + the auxiliary *do* + the subject + the infinitive when asking about the time of a specific event or habit.

We use the preposition **at** + the time to answer.

- **What time does** your class **start?**
My class starts **at** twenty to twelve.
