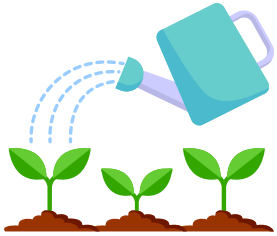

Difference between -have to, must and should.

- We use **-have to** and **must** when it 's compulsory, an obligation.
Ex: I have to clean.
- We use **-should** when we give recommendations, so you do not have to do it.
Ex: You **should** tidy up your classroom.

-HAVE TO: tienes que
-MUST: debes
-SHOULD: deberías
